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INTRODUCTION

CRIME IN WASHINGTON STATE 1981 is the second annual publication compiled by the Washington Uniform Crime Reporting program (WUCR). WUCR and this report was partially funded by the Bureau of Justice Statistics, Law Enforcement Assistance Administration of the United States Department of Justice authorized under the Crime Control Act of 1973, through grants DF-80-65-6038 and 82-BJ-CX-0003. While the grant has been assigned to the Washington State Patrol, administration of WUCR is the responsibility of the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) as sub-grantees. WUCR is unique in that it is the only state UCR program that is sponsored, administered, and supported by an organization of contributing agency administrators, rather than a bureau or department of state government.

WASHINGTON UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM

Data for CRIME IN WASHINGTON STATE 1981 are compiled from monthly UCR documents, submitted by law enforcement agencies throughout the State of Washington. UCR is a national program for the collection of crime and arrest trend information from sheriffs offices and police departments that was developed by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) in 1929. While IACP originated the program and continues to exercise policy control through its Committee on Uniform Crime Records, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) has been responsible for the administration of the program, the collection of data, and the publication of reports since 1930. WUCR was activated in October, 1979 and began the collection of monthly reports from contributing agencies in January, 1980. At the present time the program is operated manually. However, a computer program designed to provide automated data input processing and magnetic tape output is scheduled to become operational by the end of 1982.

WUCR PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the WUCR program are to implement and administer a uniform system of collecting crime and arrest statistical data from law enforcement agencies in the State of Washington. WUCR data, when compiled and evaluated, can provide the following information to law enforcement departments, other members of the criminal justice system, local, county, state and national agencies;

1. the number of crimes reported,
2. the geographical distribution of reported offenses,
3. the identification of the reported crimes that increased or decreased,
4. the identification of differences in volume, increases and decreases between reported offenses,
5. the number and clearance rate for reported offenses,
6. the number of arrests by charge, age, sex and ethnic origin of arrestees,
7. the number of law enforcement officers assaulted,
8. the number of commissioned and civilian law enforcement employees by sex.

CRIME FACTORS

Several factors affect the type and amount of crime that is reported to WUCR. A roster of these factors which should be considered when making comparisons of agency data appear in Crime in the United States, Uniform Crime Reports, 1980, and are listed for the convenience of WUCR data users;

1. the density and size of community population, and of its surrounding area,
2. the variations in composition of the population, particularly age structure,

3. the stability of population with respect to transient factors,
4. the economic conditions, including job availability,
5. the cultural conditions, such as educational, recreational and religious characteristics,
6. the climate,
7. the effective strength of law enforcement agencies,
8. the administrative and investigative emphases of law enforcement,
9. the policies of other components of the criminal justice system (i.e., prosecutorial, judicial, correctional and probational),
10. the attitudes of citizenry toward crime,
11. the crime reporting practices of citizenry.

CRIME INDEX AND CRIME RATE

TABLES 1 & 2

The number of murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft offenses reported comprise the FBI Crime Index. The number of offenses reported in relationship to the population is called the Crime Rate. (See "Crime Rate" in the glossary section for a definition and method of computing this type of information). In this report data from those agencies which reported for all months in both 1980 and 1981 are used to compile these tables. However, all departments that reported in 1980 and 1981 are shown in the Part 1 Crimes and Clearance tables, located in the appendix section.







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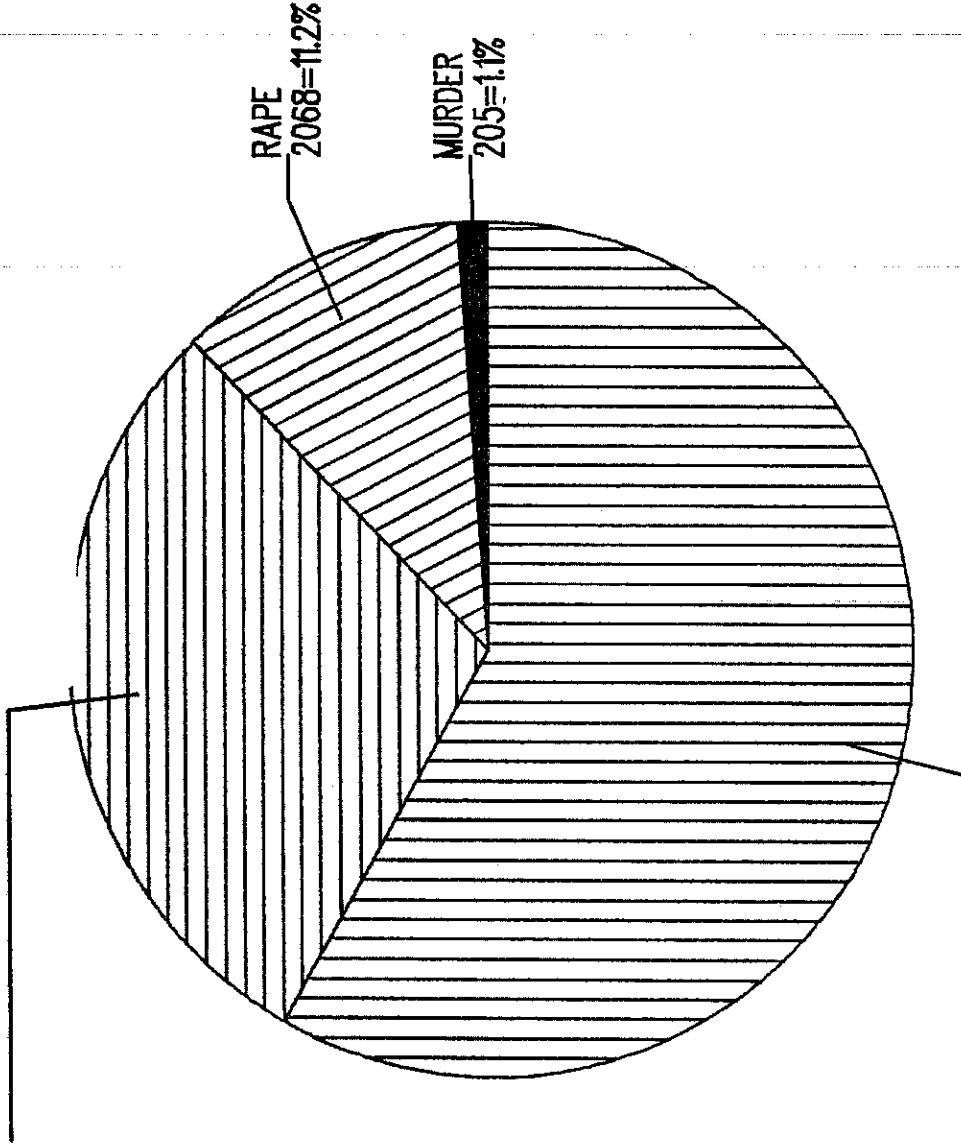
VIOLENT CRIMES PER 100,000 POPULATION

The number of Violent Crimes¹ reported increased 0.9 percent, while the crime rate² decreased 2.1 percent. For cities over 100,000 population the number of violent crimes reported increased 0.8 percent, while the crime rate decreased 1.5 percent.

For cities between 50,000 and 100,000 population the number of violent crimes reported decreased 5.3 percent, while the crime rate decreased 7.4 percent.

For cities between 25,000 and 50,000 population the number of violent crimes decreased 0.3 percent, while the crime rate decreased 2.0 percent.

For cities between 10,000 and 25,000 population the number of violent crimes reported increased 5.2 percent, while the crime rate decreased 2.7 percent.

For cities under 10,000 population the number of violent crimes reported increased 1.1 percent, while the crime rate decreased 3.3 percent.

For suburban counties³ the number of violent crimes reported decreased 2.7 percent, while the crime rate decreased 5.6 percent.

For rural counties⁴ the number of violent crimes increased 17.1 percent, while the crime rate increased 11.9 percent.

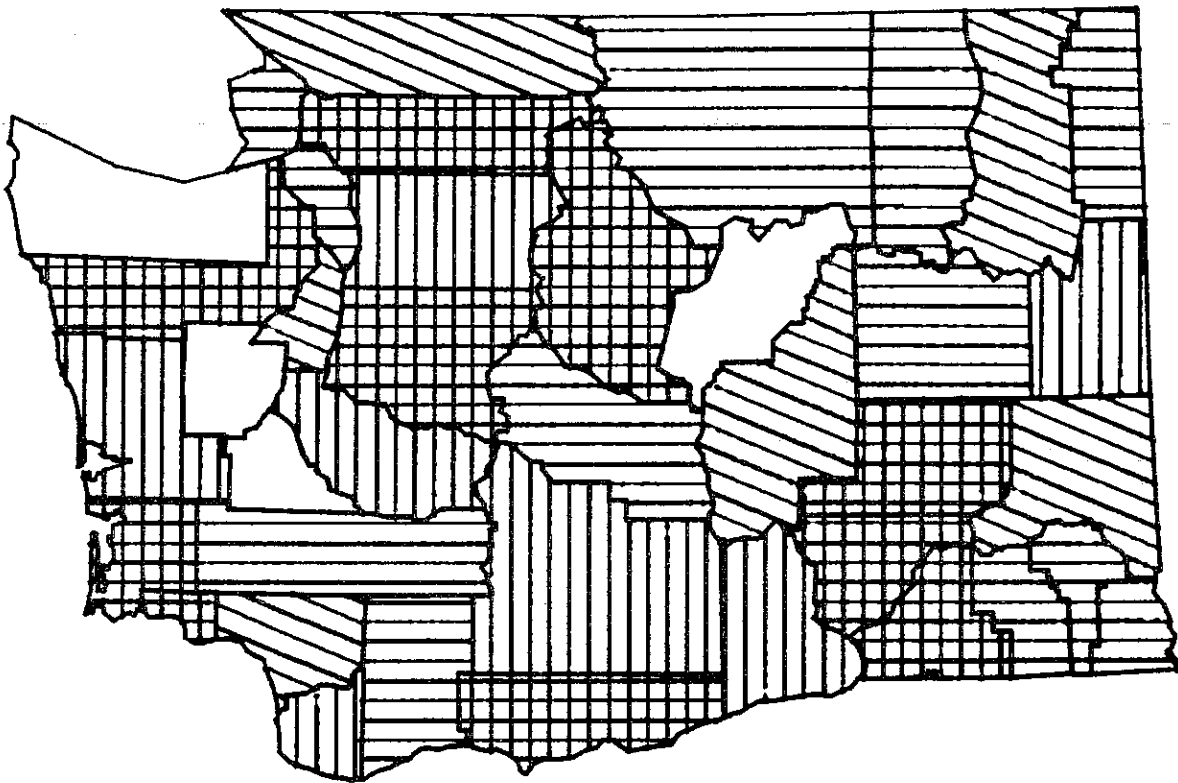

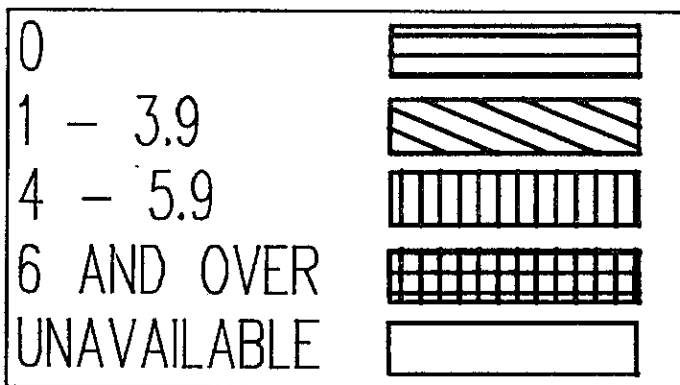

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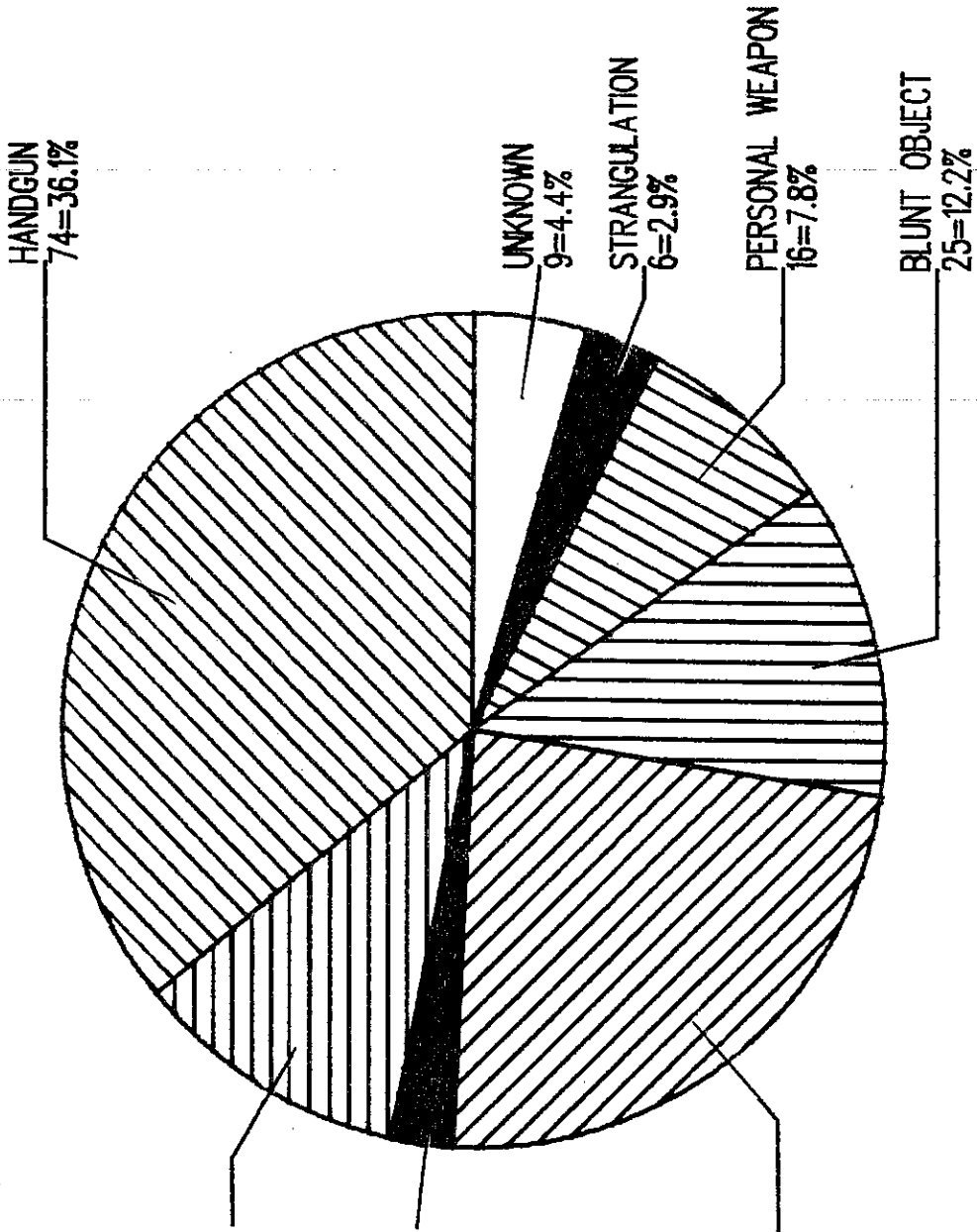


MURDERS PER 100,000 POPULATION

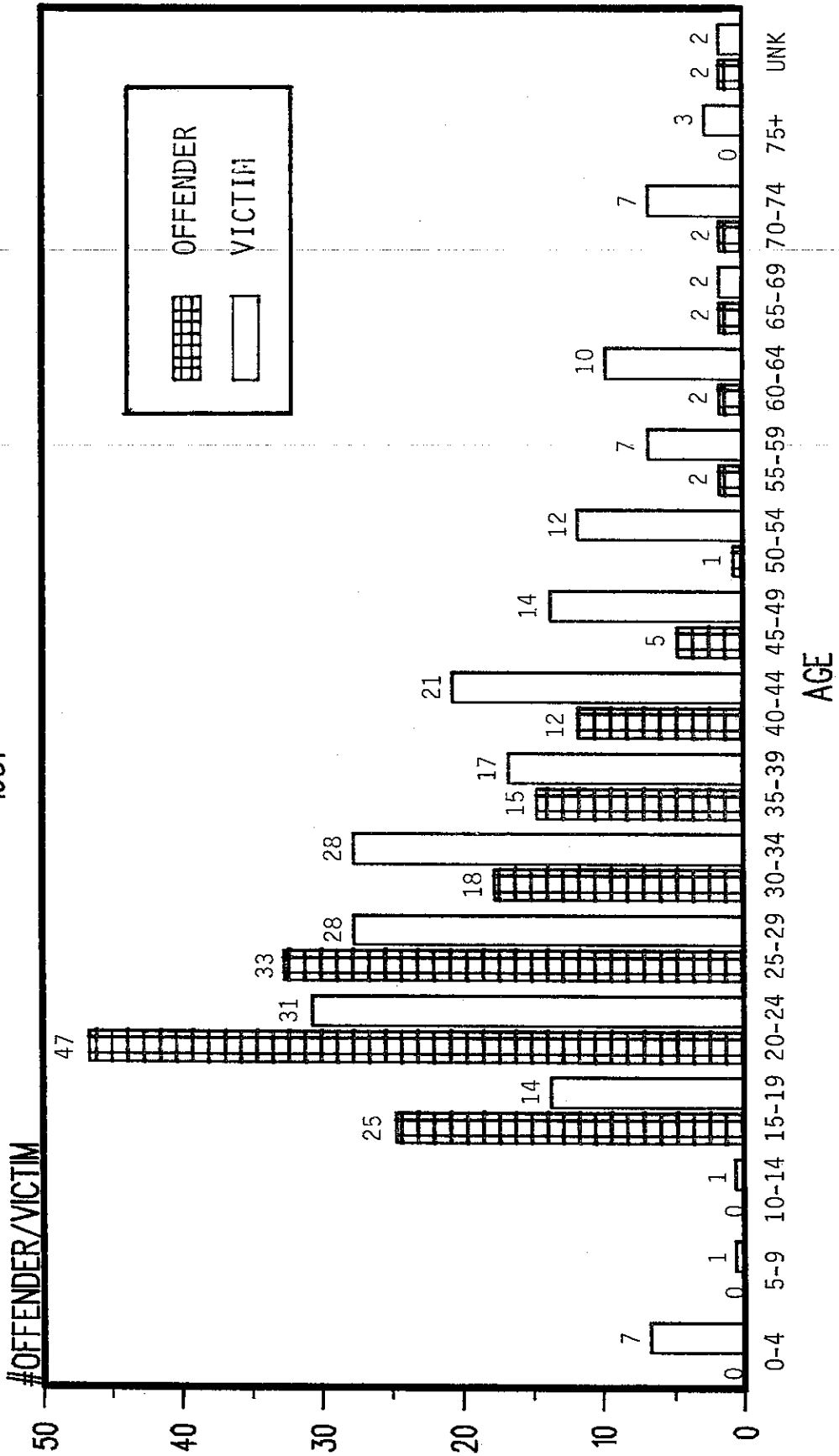

The statewide number of murders reported decreased 6.1 percent, while the crime rate¹ decreased 9.0 percent.

For cities over 100,000 population the number of murders reported decreased 9.1 percent, while the crime rate decreased 11.2 percent.

For cities between 50,000 and 100,000 population the number of murders reported decreased 4.0 percent, while the crime rate decreased 41.1 percent.

For cities between 25,000 and 50,000 population the number of murders reported increased 58.3 percent, while the crime rate increased 55.8 percent.

For cities between 10,000 and 25,000 population the number of murders reported decreased 50.0 percent, while the crime rate decreased 50.0 percent.

For cities under 10,000 population the number of murders increased 63.6 percent, while the crime rate increased 56.5 percent.

The statewide number of forcible rapes reported decreased 3.2 percent, while the crime rate¹ decreased 6.2 percent.

For cities over 100,000 population the number of forcible rapes reported decreased 7.1 percent, while the crime rate decreased 9.2 percent.

For cities between 50,000 and 100,000 population the number of forcible rapes reported increased 7.1 percent, while the crime rate increased 4.1 percent.

For cities between 25,000 and 50,000 population the number of forcible rapes reported decreased 10.2 percent, while the crime rate decreased 12.3 percent.

For cities between 10,000 and 25,000 population the number of forcible rapes reported decreased 4.7 percent, while the crime rate decreased 6.3 percent.

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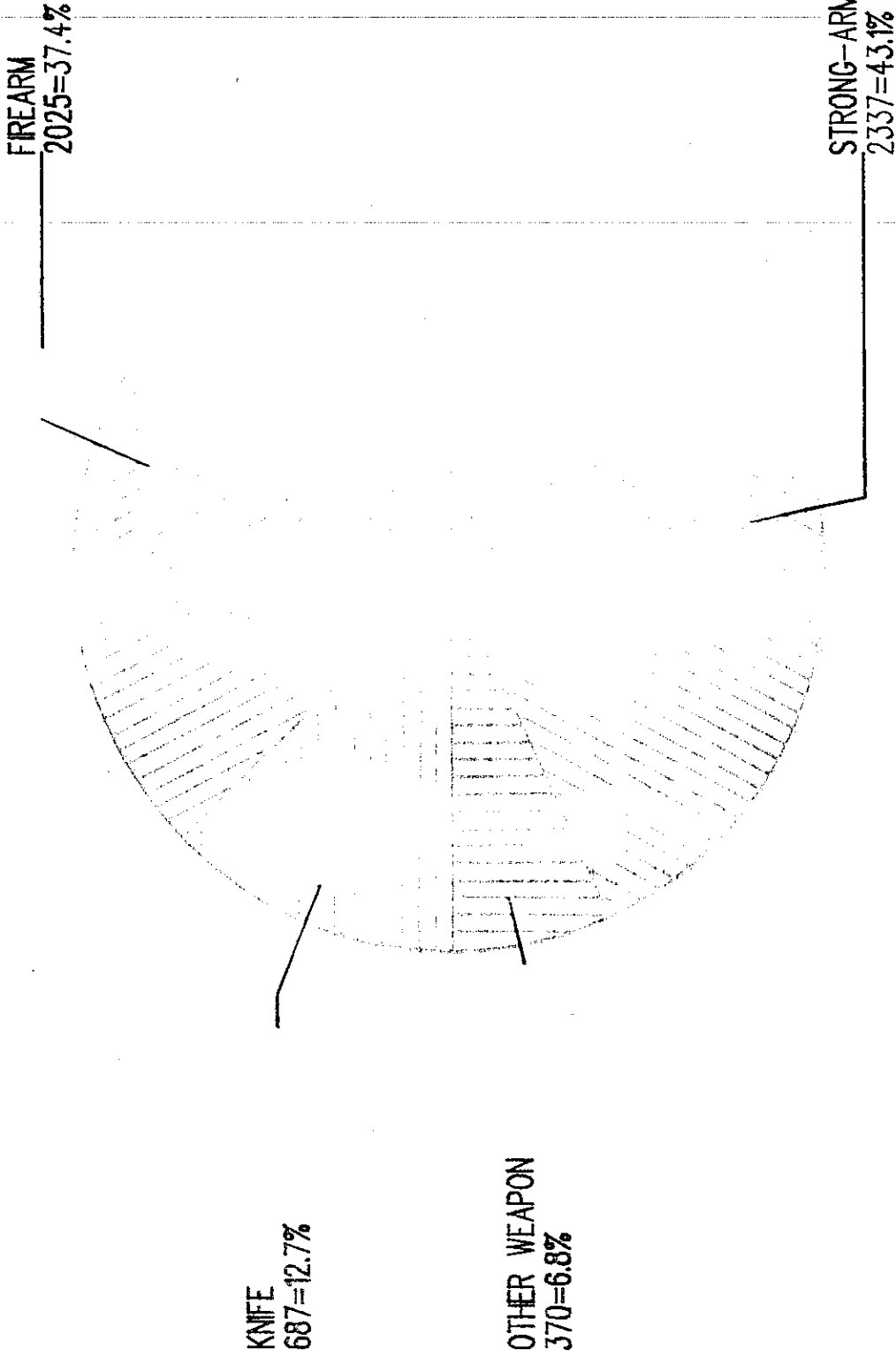


ROBBERIES PER 100,000 POPULATION

ROBBERY BY WEAPON

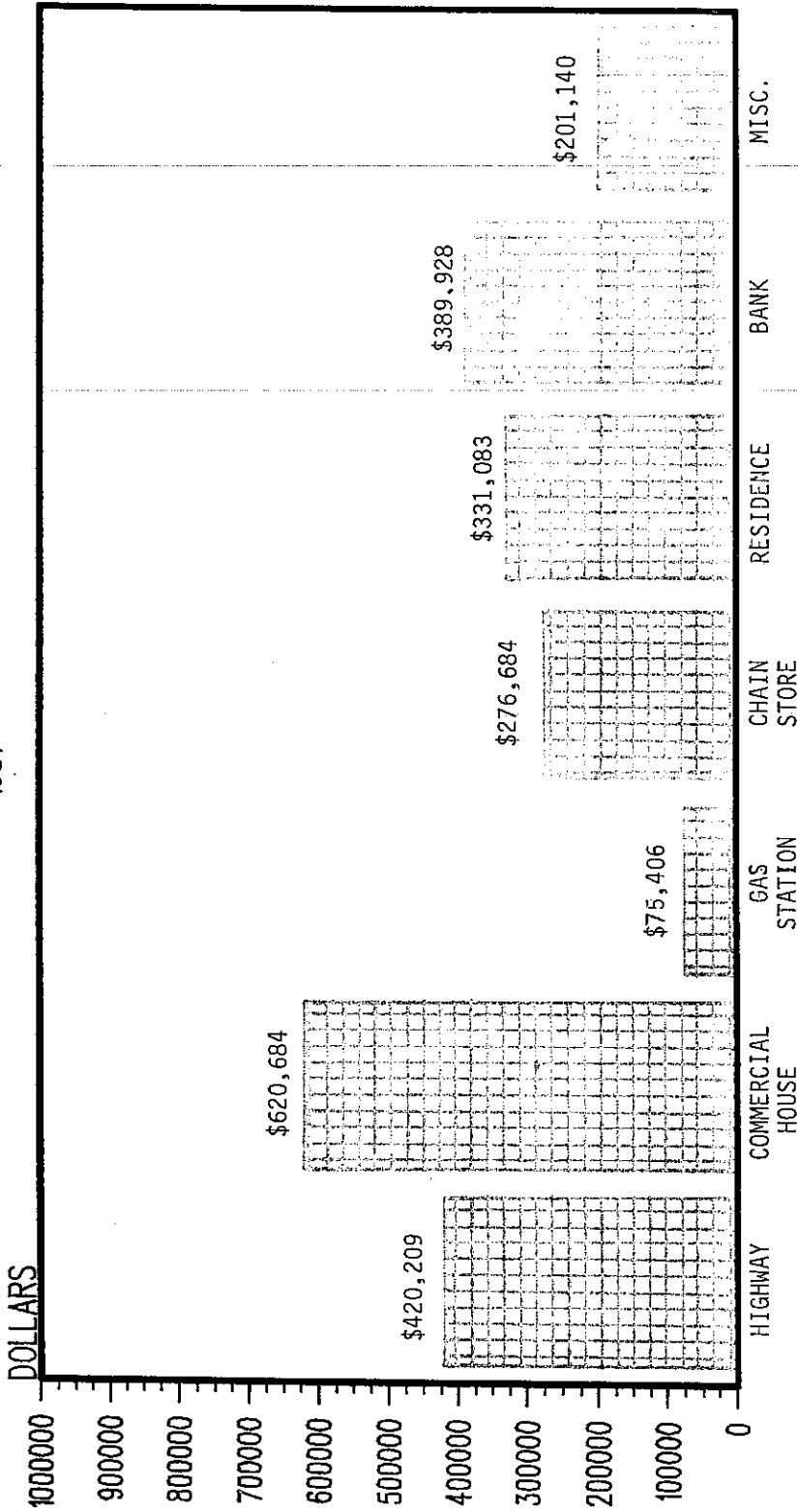

The statewide number of robberies reported decreased 1.3 percent, while the crime rate¹ decreased 4.3 percent.

For cities over 100,000 population the number of robberies reported decreased 0.6 percent, while the crime rate decreased 1.7 percent.

For cities between 50,000 and 100,000 population the number of robberies reported decreased 4.1 percent, while the crime rate decreased 6.2 percent.

For cities between 25,000 and 50,000 population the number of robberies reported decreased 10.4 percent, while the crime rate decreased 12.5 percent.

For cities between 10,000 and 25,000 population the number of robberies reported decreased 0.7 percent, while the crime index decreased 3.0 percent.

For cities over 100,000 population the number of aggravated assaults reported increased 3.0 percent, while the crime rate increased 0.6 percent.

For cities between 50,000 and 100,000 population the number of aggravated assaults reported decreased 7.3 percent, while the crime rate decreased 9.3 percent.








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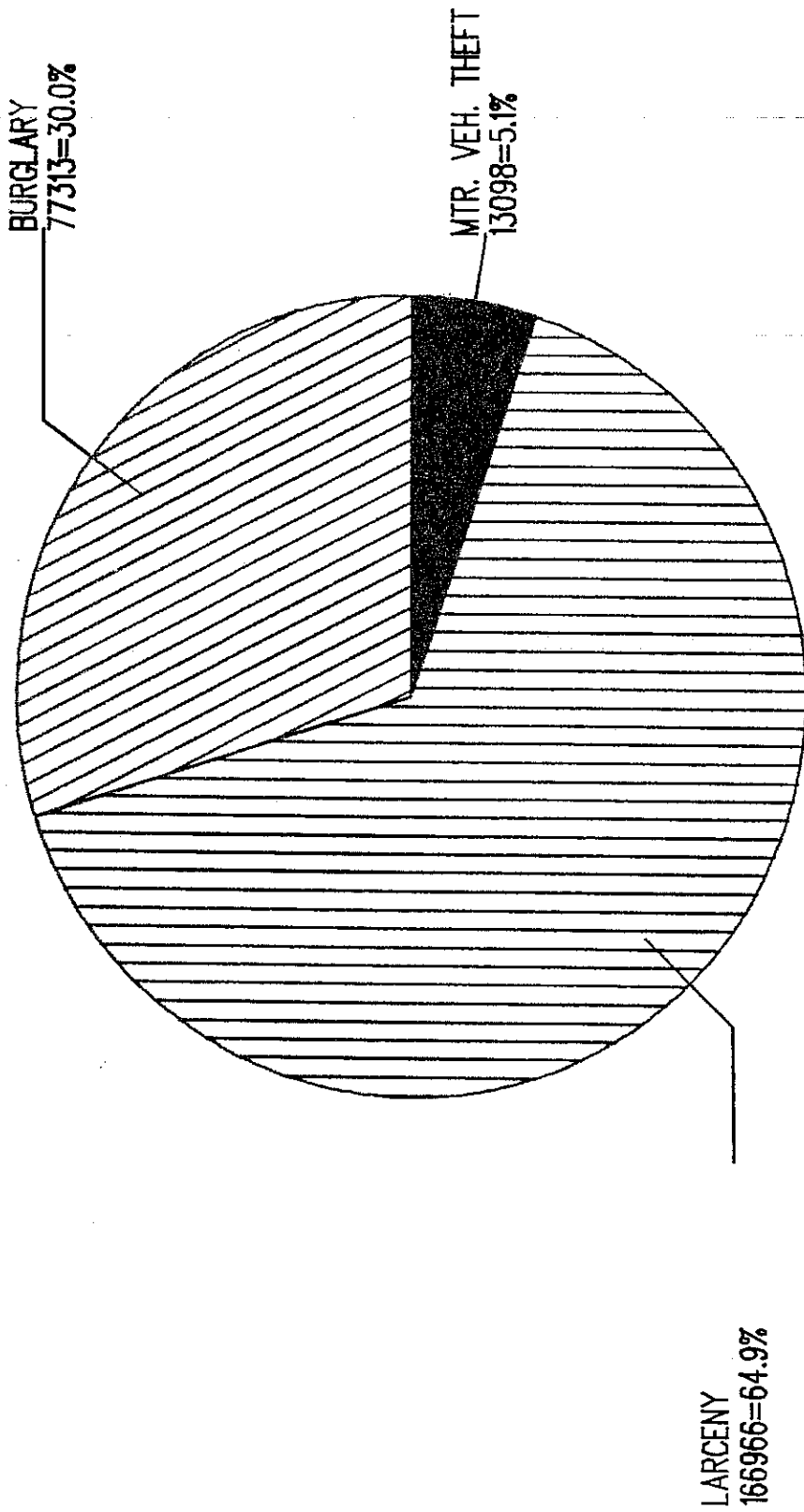


PROPERTY CRIMES PER 100,000 POPULATION

For cities over 100,000 population the number of property crimes reported increased 1.7 percent, while the crime rate decreased 0.7 percent.

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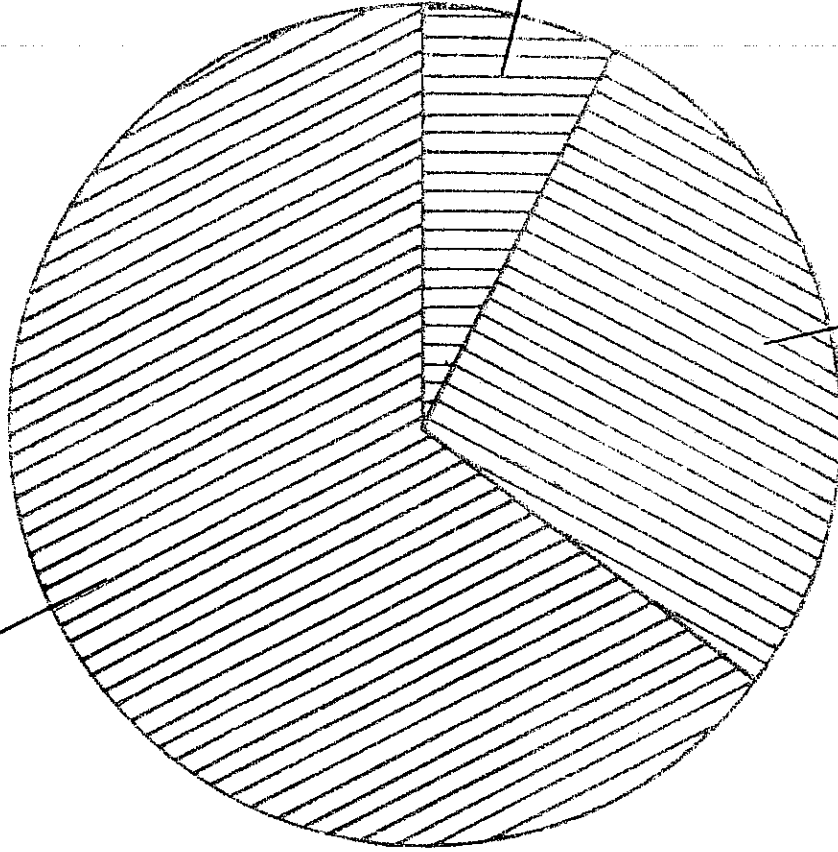
BURGLARIES PER 100,000 POPULATION

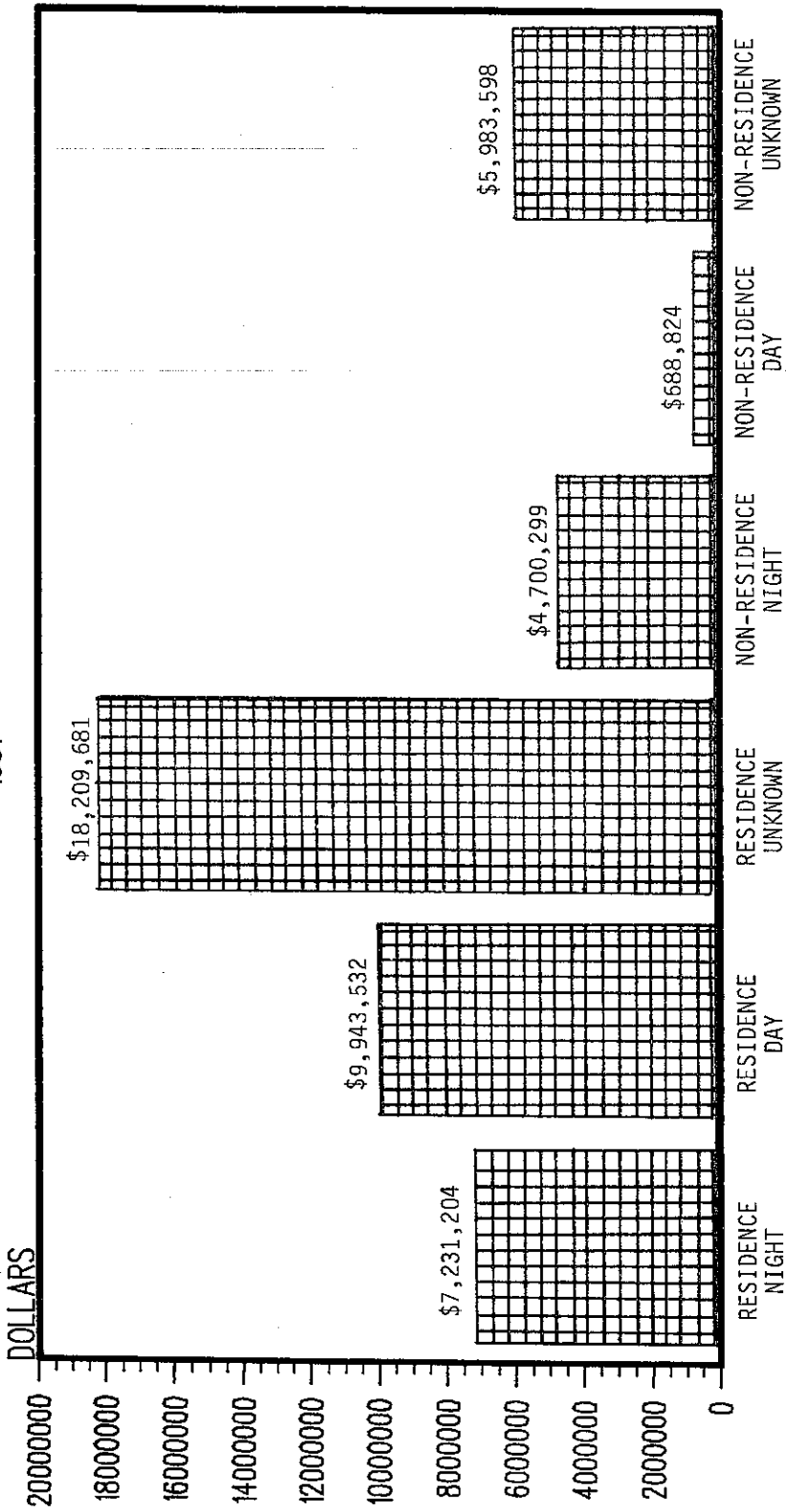

The statewide number of larceny-thefts reported decreased 0.5 percent, while the crime rate¹ decreased 3.5 percent.

For cities over 100,000 population the number of larceny-thefts reported increased 3.4 percent, while the crime rate increased 1.0 percent.

For cities between 50,000 and 100,000 population the number of larceny-thefts reported increased 0.2 percent, while the crime rate decreased 2.0 percent.

For cities between 25,000 and 50,000 population the number of larceny-thefts reported decreased 7.0 percent, while the crime rate decreased 9.1 percent.

For cities between 10,000 and 25,000 population the number of larceny-thefts increased 0.4 percent, while the crime rate decreased 1.9 percent.

For cities under 10,000 population the number of larceny-thefts reported decreased 2.2 percent, while the crime rate decreased 6.4 percent.

For suburban counties² the number of larceny-thefts reported decreased 2.0 percent, while the crime rate decreased 4.9 percent.

For rural counties³ the number of larceny-thefts reported decreased 2.1 percent, while the crime rate decreased 6.5 percent.

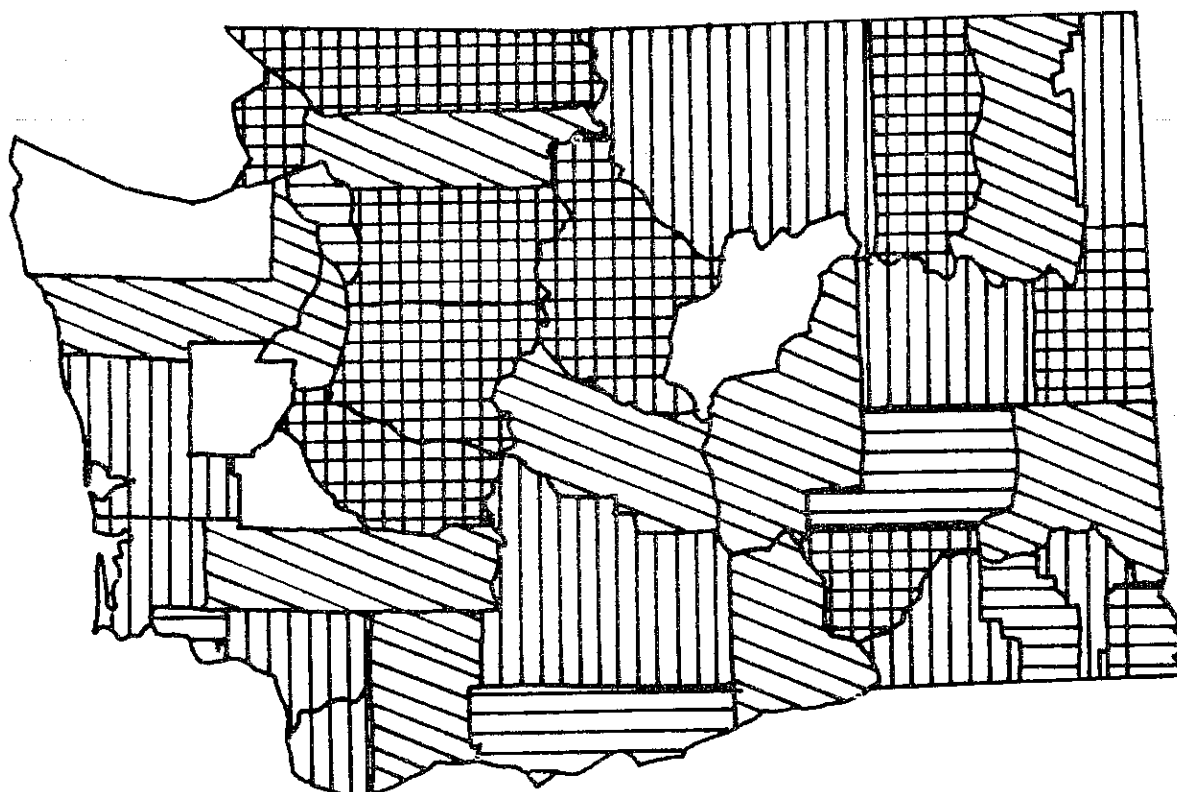

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MOTOR VEHICLE THEFTS PER 100,000 POPULATION



WUCR GLOSSARY

- ADULT: a person 18 years of age or older at the time of committing a crime.
- ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED: an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.
- ASSAULT, SIMPLE: those assaults which do not involve the use of a dangerous weapon or in which there were no serious or severe injuries to the victims.
- ARREST RATE: the number of arrests per 100,000 population (see Crime Rate for method of computation).
- BURGLARY: the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.
- CLEARANCE: the solving of an offense by the arrest, charging and turning over for prosecution a person or persons.
- CLEARANCE RATE: percentage of the total of crimes cleared, compared to the number reported.
Example:[@]
- a. Number of clearances in robbery, 38
 - b. Number of total robberies, 72
- Divide: 38 by 72 = 528
- Multiply: 528 by 100 = 52.8
- CRIME: an act committed or omitted in violation of a law forbidding or commanding it.
- CRIME RATE: the number of crimes per 100,000 population. To compute rates, divide the jurisdiction's population by 100,000 and divide this number into the number of offenses
Example:[@]
- a. Population of jurisdiction 75,000
 - b. Number of reported burglaries for the jurisdiction for the time period under consideration is 215
- Divide: 75,000 by 100,000 = .75
- Divide: 215 by .75 = 286.7
- The burglary rate is 286.7 per 100,000 population.
- FBI CRIME INDEX: seven offenses which were selected because of their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and likelihood of being reported to the police. The offenses are: murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft.
- JUVENILE: a person under the age of 18 at the time of committing a crime.

LARCENY-THEFT: the unlawful taking, carrying, leading or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another.

MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER: the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT: the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. (A motor vehicle is defined for UCR purposes as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails.)

PART I OFFENSES: same as "Seven Major Offenses."

PART II OFFENSES: all crime classifications outside of those defined as Part I.

PERSONAL WEAPONS: hands, fists, feet, etc.

PROPERTY CRIMES: burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft.

FORCIBLE RAPE: the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

ROBBERY: the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

SEVEN MAJOR OFFENSES: offenses most likely to be reported to the police by the public. These offenses include murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, and motor vehicle theft.

STRUCTURE: a building having four sides and roof which is used by man to shelter himself or his property.
