

SUMMARY

1982

- * Crime Index Offenses (Part I Crimes) decreased from 275,760 in 1981 to 260,742 in 1982, a decrease of 5.4%.
- * Violent Crimes decreased 8.2% from 18,383 in 1981 to 16,884 in 1982.
 - Murder and non-negligent homicides decreased 11.2% from 205 to 182.
 - Rape decreased 7.4% from 2068 in 1981 to 1916 in 1982.
 - Robbery decreased 8.5% from 5419 in 1981 to 4960 in 1982
 - Aggravated assault went down from 10,691 in 1981 to 9826 in 1982, an 8.1% decrease.
- * Property Crimes decreased by 5.3% in 1982, from 257,377 in 1981 to 243,858 in 1982.
 - Burglary decreased from 77,313 in 1981 to 69,888 in 1982 for a 9.6% decrease.
 - Larceny (theft) decreased from 166,966 in 1981 to 162,281 in 1982 for a 2.8% decrease.
 - Motor vehicle theft decreased from 13,098 in 1981 to 11,689 in 1982 for a 10.8% decrease.
- * The value of property stolen in 1982 totaled \$117,014,224.00 an increase of 1.2% compared to \$115,667,891.00 in 1981.
- * The value of property recovered in 1982 amounted to \$32,278,594.00 a 2.1% increase compared to \$31,604,456.00 in 1981.
- * Arrests totaled 166,534 in 1982 compared to 149,209 in 1981 for a 11.6% increase.
- * One law enforcement officer was killed in the line of duty in 1982. Another officer died by accident in the line of duty.
- * Assaults on law enforcement officers totaled 1193 in 1982 compared to 1210 in 1981 for a 1.4% decrease.
- * Law enforcement agencies employed 9060 full-time people in 1982 compared to 8948 in 1981 for a 1.3% increase.
 - There were 6608 full-time commissioned officers in 1982 compared to 6472 in 1981 for a 2.1% increase.
 - There were 2452 full-time civilian employees in 1982 compared to 2476 in 1981 for a 1.0% decrease.

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INTRODUCTION

This is the third annual report of criminal offenses and arrests produced by the Washington Uniform Crime Reporting program (WUCR). WUCR and this report was partially funded by the Bureau of Justice Statistics, Law Enforcement Assistance Administration of the United States Department of Justice authorized under the Crime Control Act of 1973, through grants DF-80-65-6038 and 82-BJ-CX-0003. Even though this grant was assigned to the Washington State Patrol, administration of WUCR is the responsibility of the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) as subgrantees. Additionally, the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission provided funds to supplement the federal uniform crime reporting grant. WUCR is unique in that it is the only state UCR program that is sponsored, administered, and supported by an organization of contributing agency administrators, rather than a bureau or department of state government.

WASHINGTON UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM

Although the impetus for collecting nationwide crime information dates back to the 1890's, no ongoing program was initiated until the Committee on Uniform Crime Records of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) was established in 1917. This committee's responsibility to provide management information to law enforcement agencies was eventually turned over to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in 1930, when the FBI received a congressional mandate to collect and disseminate

national crime information. The IACP has continued to serve the Uniform Crime Reporting Program (UCR) in an advisory capacity, and has been joined in this responsibility by the committee on Crime Records of the National Sheriff's Association.

Data for CRIME IN WASHINGTON STATE 1982 are compiled from monthly UCR reports submitted by individual law enforcement agencies throughout the State of Washington. WUCR was activated in October, 1979, and began the collection of monthly reports from contributing agencies in January, 1980. At the present time the UCR program is operated on a semi-manual and computerized basis. The computer program designed to provide automated data input processing and provide a magnetic tape output to the FBI is in a testing mode and should become operational very shortly.

OBJECTIVES OF WASHINGTON'S UCR

Increasing attention has been focused on the problem of crime in our communities in recent years. Because of this program, many segments of our population needs more complete information for a variety of reasons.

Citizens are understandably concerned about the possibility of becoming victims of crime, but may not know what the real probability is. Law enforcement professionals, managers and administrators who must focus on crime in their own jurisdictions, also need to know what is occurring in surrounding jurisdictions in order to deploy personnel and equipment most efficiently to protect citizens and bring criminals to justice. Legislators need statewide information about crime in order to pass realistic laws that will increase the stability of our

society. Researchers and planners need to know what is actually happening to predict trends and recommend changes.

The objectives of CRIME IN WASHINGTON STATE 1982 are to implement and administer a uniform system of collecting crime and arrest statistical data from contributing law enforcement agencies in the State of Washington and present the information needed by each of these groups. This information will not in itself prevent crime, but it may encourage segments of society by understanding the problem and to work together with law enforcement agencies to reduce crime through more effective enforcement.

Additional objectives of CRIME IN WASHINGTON STATE 1982 when compiled and evaluated are:

1. To identify the number of crimes reported by contributing agencies.
2. To identify the geographical distribution of reported offenses.
3. To determine whether or not reported crimes have increased or decreased.
4. To determine whether or not reported crimes have increased or decreased by population groups.
5. To determine the number and clearance rate for reported offenses.
6. To determine the reported number of arrests by charge, age, sex and ethnic origin of those persons arrested.
7. To determine the number of law enforcement officers assaulted and killed.
8. To determine the number of commissioned (sworn) and civilian law enforcement employees by sex.
9. To determine the rate per population group of commissioned (sworn) and civilian law enforcement employees.

CRIME FACTORS

Care should be taken in drawing conclusions and making decisions about problems based solely on crime and arrest data that is reported to WUCR. Factors relating to crime reporting practices, law enforcement policies, population characteristics and attitudes all contribute to variation in reported data.

Some general factors which may affect the amount of crime reported and type of crime committed are:

1. The density and size of the community population and of its surrounding area.
2. The variations in composition of the population, particularly to age.
3. The economic status, education, and recreation characteristics of the community population.
4. The relative stability of the population, including commuters, seasonal, and other transient types.
5. The climate, including seasonal weather conditions, and other geographical variations.
6. The religious characteristics of the popualtion.
7. The effective strength of law enforcement agencies.
8. The policies of other components of the criminal justice system (i.e., prosecutorial, judicial, correctional and probational).
9. The attitude of the public toward law enforcement problems.
10. The crime reporting practices of the citizenry.
11. The administrative and investigative follow-up of the local law enforcement agency, including the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards.

WUCR STATISTICAL INTERPRETATION

Statistics are a tool used to summarize information so that patterns or trends become clearer. All statistics must be interpreted with an understanding of just what it is that they can say. Too often, numbers of the type in this report are used incorrectly to draw conclusions that the statistics simply do not support. In order to avoid this error, it is necessary to know what information is included and how it is reported.

To obtain accurate information from many different agencies, the national UCR program had to precisely define the methods for counting such information as the number of offenses, arrests, clearances and value of stolen or recovered property. The methods of counting and some resulting limitations are explained below.

CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENSES

UCR divides offenses into two major classifications which are designated Part I and Part II offenses. This distinction is important to keep in mind because different information is collected for each. Part I offenses include 1. Violent Crimes: murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault; and 2. Property Crimes: burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft and (since January, 1979) arson. These reported Part I offenses comprise the FBI Crime Index. All other offenses are classified under Part II offenses.

Part I offenses, excluding arson, are used to calculate the Crime Index and Crime Rate.

All offenses are classified on the basis of law enforcement investigation in accordance with UCR offense definitions (which are NOT necessarily identical to the Revised Code of

Washington definitions). Because WUCR identifies and tallies a police problem, offense classifications are not based on the findings of a court, medical examiner, jury or other judicial findings.

COUNTING OF OFFENSES

The number of offenses is counted only for Part I crimes and simple assault. The method of counting varies with the type of crime committed, and it is important to remember that the number of offenders does not determine the number of offenses.

For murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, aggravated assault and simple assault, one offense is counted for each VICTIM, regardless of the number of offenders involved.

For robbery and larceny, one offense is counted for each distinct OPERATION which is separate in time and place. The number of victims in any one operation does not determine the number of offenses. For example, if 20 people are robbed in a bar at the same time, only ONE offense has occurred. However, if that robber then leaves the bar and holds up a passerby, a second offense has occurred.

For burglary, one offense is counted for each structure which is illegally entered. However, when the structure is an apartment house, or business or office building in which units are leased for a period of time, one offense is counted for each unit burglarized.

For motor vehicle theft, one offense is counted for each vehicle stolen.

Note: Attempts to commit any of the Crime Index offense are counted as actual offenses, except that attempts to kill and assaults to kill are counted as aggravated assaults.

For multiple offenses that occur in one crime incident, only the

most serious offense is counted. Part I crimes are ranked according to seriousness and appear in order from most serious to least serious crimes. Example: A robber takes a man's wallet and then beats him causing serious injury. Both a robbery and an aggravated assault have occurred, but because robbery is considered by UCR to be more serious, only the robbery is counted. From one perspective, this method of counting seriously understates the crime problem, but from another, it prevents undue inflation of crime statistics.

- Notes:
1. Arson is an exception to the above rule and is counted separately from other offenses.
 2. The number of offenses is not counted for Part II offenses.

ARRESTS

Arrest information is collected for all Part I and Part II offenses according to the age, sex and race of the offender. It is not possible, however, to correlate race with sex or specific ages because the information is collected independently, thus limiting analysis. Furthermore, arrest figures cannot be directly related to the number of crimes cleared because the arrest totals count all offenders arrested for each offense, and clearance-totals count only the offenses for which an arrest or arrests have occurred.

CLEARANCES

An offense is considered cleared (solved) when at least one offender is arrested for a crime, even though several may have been involved. Offenses may also be cleared by exceptional means when the offender commits suicide, makes a dying declaration, confesses while in custody or serving time for another crime, is prosecuted in another jurisdiction for the same offense, is a juvenile who is handled by notifying the parents, or when the victim refuses to prosecute or another jurisdiction refuses to extradite the offender, etc..

Clearances are counted as "adult" and "juvenile". A "juvenile" clearance is counted only when juveniles are exclusively involved in the clearance of an offense. If the arrest of both adults and juveniles result in a clearance, it is counted as an "adult" clearance.

Note: Not all crimes are cleared within the calendar year in which the offense occurs.

INFORMATION GROUPING

The crime statistics reported by an individual agency indicate what is happening in one particular area, but to make rational comparisons among a number of jurisdictions, communities with similar characteristics need to be grouped together. It may be important to know how a city compares with cities of similar size, or how patterns of crime differ in various types of communities. Grouping agencies with similar characteristics allows these determinations to be made. Aside from being merely interesting, such comparative analysis provides the basic information for long-range criminal justice planning.

WUCR groups jurisdictions on the basis of population size in this report and if any types of comparisons are to be made the reader should also consider what type of community it is that he is comparing. Grouping by population size considers only the population of the relevant area in this report. It does not consider proximity to a major metropolitan area in spite of the fact that widely different crime patterns could be expected in a city of 30,000 which is a suburb of Seattle or Tacoma and one which is in a rural area. In this report, grouping by population does not take into account the urban/suburban/rural character of the area, and includes a wide range of populations in each category. For use in interpreting this report, the WUCR grouping system are listed below.

CRIME INDEX

The Crime Index is a basic measure of crime which can be used for comparing the extent of crime among cities, counties and states of similar size. The Index is simply the total number of certain offenses that occur in a given area in a given calendar period (usually quarterly and annually). The offenses are murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft--all of the Part I offenses except simple assault.

The offenses were selected as indicators of the total amount of criminal activity because they are serious offenses that are the focus of widespread concern; they occur with sufficient frequency to reflect fluctuations in the overall level of criminal activity; they are most likely to be reported, and reported accurately, to law enforcement officers due to their seriousness; and, they are offenses that can be clearly and specifically defined.

Notwithstanding its usefulness, the Index does have limitations. The relationship between the Index offenses and total criminal

activity, both reported and unreported, has never been firmly established. The varying severity of offenses is not taken into account, resulting in equal weight being given to a shop lifting and a forcible rape. Further-more, the actual incidence of crime in a city may not be accurately depicted by the Index if the majority of the city's crime involves non-Index offenses such as gambling and narcotics.

CRIME RATE


The Crime Rate is based on the Index, but adjusts the Index for variances in population by indicating the number of Index offenses for each 1,000 persons (other base population increments may be used such as the number of Index offenses per 100,000). This means that comparisons may be made among several areas with different populations, or within one area with different populations over a period of time, without the information being biased by population differences. For most general comparisons, the Crime Rate is probably the most accurate to use.

To calculate the Crime Rate, first divide the population of the area by 1,000, and divide the Crime Index by that answer. For example, if a city has a population of 273,000 and a Crime Index of 21,257, the calculations would be:

1. 273,000 divided by 1,000 = 273.00
2. 21,257 divided by 273.00 = 77.86

Thus, although the city's Crime Index is 21,257, its Crime Rate (the number of crimes for each 1,000 people) is 77.86.


VIOLENT CRIME 1982

OFFENDER/VICTIM








RAPE BY FORCE

FORCIBLE RAPE OFFENSES = 1916


ROBBERY BY WEAPON

1982




ROBBERY OFFENSES = 4960

ROBBERY BY LOCATION 1982




VALUE DATA REPRESENT 4773 OFFENSES

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT BY WEAPON 1982




AGGRAVATED ASSAULT ONLY—

PROPERTY CRIME OFFENSES=243,858


BURGLARY BY TYPE OF ENTRY 1982

BURGLARY BY LOCATION & TIME



LARCENY BY TYPE & VALUE 1982




LARCENY VALUE = \$41,562,632

VALUE DATA REPRESENT 150,876 OFFENSES


LARCENY BY CATEGORY

ARSON

Arson is defined under the Uniform Crime Reporting program to include any willful or malicious burning or attempts to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc... The Hierarchy Rule does not apply to the offense of arson. Any other Crime Index offenses occurring in conjunction with an arson should be reported in accordance with the Hierarchy Rule. The arson offense should be reported on the "Monthly Return of Arson Offenses Known to Law Enforcement."

In October, 1978, the United States Congress passed legislation that mandated arson be classified as a Part I Crime Index offense in the Uniform Crime Reporting program. On October 12, 1982, Public Law 97-298 was signed into law by the President directing that the offense of arson be permanently classified as a Part I Crime.

There were 1704 arsons reported to the WUCR program in 1982. Of the total number of arsons, 1159 or 68% involved structural property, 307 or 18% involved mobile property, and 238 or 14% involved other property. "Other" property includes crops, timber, fences, signs and any property stored outside structures. Only 7% of the structural property which was burned was uninhabited, abandoned or not normally in use. Property damage due to arson totaled \$35,130,368, of which \$18,868,575 was structural, \$15,458,612 was mobile, and \$803,181 was in the "Total Other" category. About 14 million in the mobile category was due to a boat arson in October, 1982, in the Everett area.

Washington Law Enforcement agencies cleared 26% of the arsons reported.

* LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Law enforcement officers may become victims of assault as a consequence of their occupations. The Uniform Crime Report addresses all assaults on officers which involve "more than mere verbal abuse or minor resistance to an arrest."

In 1982, contributing agencies reported 1193 officer assaults with 34.5% of the total assaults resulting in personal injury to the officer. The type of activity that an officer was most likely to be assaulted in was responding to a "disturbance call," which accounted for 31.9% of the total. Other activities of significance were attempting other arrests, 24.6% of the total; traffic pursuits and stops, 13.2% of the total; and handling, transporting and custody of prisoners, 8.5% of the total.

Hands, fists and feet were used in 83.8% of the assaults, followed by other dangerous weapons 7.8%, firearms 5.2%, and knife or cutting instrument 3.2%. The type of assignment where most assaults occurred was a two-person vehicle which resulted in 421 assaults or 35.3%, followed by a one-person vehicle when the officer was assisted, 352 assaults or 29.5% of the assaults. During a 24 hour period using 8 hour shifts, the shift when most assaults occurred was 4 P.M. to 12 midnight, 580 assaults or 48.6%, with the least amount occurring between 8 A.M. to 4 P.M., 142 assaults or 11.9%.

Combining these factors, an officer stands the highest risk of assault when responding to a disturbance call between the hours of 4 P.M. and 12 midnight, in a two-person vehicle with

the offender using his hands, fists, or feet as a weapon.

During 1982, police assaults were cleared (by arrest or exceptional means) 95.3% of the time.

WASHINGTON ASSOCIATION OF SHERIFFS AND POLICE CHIEFS

"IN MEMORIAM"

Sergeant Samuel Hicks, age 38, of the King County Police, Homicide Section, was killed on June 24, 1982 while attempting to apprehend a murder suspect in the Black Diamond area. The 13½ year veteran was shot once with a .308 rifle and died enroute to the hospital. A suspect was arrested about one week later and subsequently charged with aggravated first degree murder.

Senior Patrolman William "Bill" Rolcik, age 49, an 11 year veteran of the Cle Elum Police Department, died on December 22, 1982, as a result of an injury received while on duty. Patrolman Rolcik fell off icy steps on December 18, 1982. Surgery was subsequently performed with the ultimate untimely death.




CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses robbery, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft.

CRIME INDEX: Classification of seven offenses selected for their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and likelihood of being reported. Includes murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft.

CURFEW AND LOITERING LAWS - PERSONS UNDER 18: Transgressions of curfew or loitering ordinances pertaining to juveniles.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT: Committing or attempting to commit a breach of the peace. Includes affray; unlawful assembly; disturbing the peace; disturbing meetings; disorderly conduct in state institutions; prize fights; blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language; desecrating the flag, and refusing to assist an officer.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE: The driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics. This includes operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated; and operating an engine, train, street car, boat, etc., while intoxicated.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATION: Transgression of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.

DRUNKENNESS: All offenses of drunkenness or intoxication except driving while intoxicated. Includes drunkenness, drunk and disorderly common or habitual drunkard, and intoxication.

EMBEZZLEMENT: Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING: All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

FRAUD: Converting and obtaining money or property by false pretenses other than forgery or counterfeiting.

GAMBLING: Promoting, permitting, or engaging in games of chance.

INCENDIARY: Involving a deliberate burning of property.

JUVENILE: A person under the age of 18 at the time of committing a crime.

LARCENY (THEFT): The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another or the attempt to do so.

LIQUOR LAW VIOLATION: Transgression of any state or local liquor law except drunkenness and driving while intoxicated.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT: The theft or attempted theft of a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails.

MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER: The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

PART I OFFENSES: Seven major offenses as defined in the CRIME INDEX.

PART II OFFENSES: All other crime classifications outside those defined as PART I.

PROPERTY CRIMES: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft.

PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE: Committing or attempting to commit sex offenses of a commercialized nature.

RAPE: The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

REPORTED OFFENSE: An act which comes to the attention of law enforcement authorities as a possible offense.

ROBBERY: The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

RUNAWAY: Protective custody of juveniles under local statute.

SEX OFFENSES: Offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, other than forcible rape or prostitution and commercialized vice.

STOLEN PROPERTY, BUYING, RECEIVING, AND POSSESSING: Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property or the attempt to commit any such offense.

UNFOUNDED OFFENSE: An act reported to law enforcement authorities which, upon investigation, proves to be not an offense.

VAGRANCY: Offenses of vagrancy, begging, loitering (adults), vagabondage, and being a "suspicious character or person, etc."

VANDALISM: The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacing of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

VIOLENT CRIMES: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.

WEAPONS OFFENSES: Offenses and attempted offenses against weapons regulations. Includes manufacture, sale, possession, or carrying open or concealed deadly weapons or silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; possession of deadly weapons by aliens.
