SUMMARY

RATE OF INDEX CRIME	Index crimes in Washington State totaled 266,288 for 2009, constituting 40.0 offenses per 1,000 persons. This represents a decrease of 1.7% in the index crime rate over 2008.
POPULATION	**The estimated population in Washington for 2009 was 6,668,200 as compared to 6,587,600 for 2008. This represents a 1.22% increase.
VIOLENT CRIME	Violent crime offenses are murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. Reported violent crime offenses totaled 21,920 for 2009. The violent crime rate per 1,000 persons for 2009 is 3.29, which is an increase of 0.8% compared to 2008. While simple assault can be violent, it is not generally serious in nature therefore is excluded from the categorization of violent crime for this publication.
PROPERTY CRIME	Property crime offenses are burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Reported property crime offenses totaled 244,368 for 2009. The property crime rate per 1,000 persons for 2009 is 36.7, which is a decrease of 1.9% compared to 2008.
VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED	Property valued at \$284,150,267 was reported stolen in 2009. Of this amount, \$84,948,752 or 29.9% was recovered. The value of property stolen shows a decrease of 13.6% over 2008.
NUMBER OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED	Six law enforcement officers were killed feloniously and one officer killed accidentally while in the line of duty. A total of 822 law enforcement officers were assaulted during the year. Assaults on officers decreased 7.2% when compared to 2008 with 886 officer assaults reported for that year.
RATE OF CRIME CLEARANCES	There was an 18.6% clearance rate for all index crimes reported in 2009. The clearance rate for 2008 was 17.2%.
ARRESTS	A total of 244,446 arrests were reported in 2009 constituting a decrease of 2.5% over the year 2008.
DRUG ABUSE ARRESTS	There were 23,379 reported drug abuse arrests. Of this number, 11.8% were persons under 18 years of age.
DUI ARRESTS	A total of 36,831 arrests were made for DUI, which constituted 15.0% of the total arrests reported in 2009. The total represents the arrests of 36,355 adults and 476 juveniles.

**LAW ENFORCEMENT
EMPLOYEES**

In 2009, there were 14,756 full-time law enforcement employees in the State of Washington. Of these, there were 10,561 commissioned officers, which is a decrease of 2.1% under 2008.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

There were 48,186 domestic violence offenses including simple assault and violation of protection/no contact orders. This was an increase of 13.4% over 2008. A total of 244 law enforcement agencies participated in this data collection.

HATE/BIAS CRIME

There were 211 reported hate bias crime incidents by 262 participating law enforcement agencies. This represents a decrease of 10.6% over 2008. Of the 211 incidents, there were 292 hate/bias offenses. It is important to remember that there can be more than one offense within a single incident. Of 262 reporting agencies, 207 reported that there was no hate crime activity in their jurisdiction.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

CRIME IN WASHINGTON STATE 2009 was compiled from data submitted to the Washington Uniform Crime Reporting program of the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs by Washington State Law Enforcement agencies during 2009. Coverage is 99.9% of the state population.

This report would not be possible without the voluntary cooperation of Washington State's law enforcement agencies. Additionally, input and guidance from the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs WUCR/NIBRS Committee is gratefully acknowledged.

Introduction

This is the thirtieth annual report of criminal offenses, arrests, law enforcement officers killed or assaulted, and full-time law enforcement employees produced by the Washington Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program. Funding for the UCR Program is provided through contract with the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission (CJTC). Administration of the UCR Program is the responsibility of the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) Criminal Justice Information Support (CJIS) Department. Washington's UCR Program is unique in that it is sponsored, administered, and supported by an organization of contributing agency administrators rather than a bureau or department of state government.

Background

Although the collection of nationwide crime information dates back to the 1890's, no ongoing program was initiated until the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) established a committee on uniform crime records in 1917. The committee's responsibility to provide management information to law enforcement agencies was eventually turned over to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in 1930 when the FBI received a congressional mandate to collect and disseminate national crime information. The IACP has continued to serve the UCR Program in an advisory capacity and has been joined in this responsibility by the National Sheriffs Association.

Data for ***Crime in Washington State 2009*** are compiled from monthly Summary UCR submissions by individual law enforcement agencies throughout the State of Washington. The UCR Program was activated in October 1979 and began the collection of monthly reports from contributing agencies in January 1980. Today, the UCR program offers on-line data input processing and provides various reports necessary for statistical purposes in the criminal justice system.

Objectives of Washington UCR

Segments of our population need more complete, accurate, and timely information for a variety of reasons. Citizens are interested in the probability of crime in their neighborhoods and criminal justice practitioners need to know what is occurring in order to deploy personnel and equipment more efficiently to support public safety. Legislators need statewide information about crime in order to pass realistic laws that will increase the stability of our society. Researchers and planners need to know what is actually happening to predict trends and recommend changes.

The primary objectives of ***Crime in Washington State 2009*** are to implement and administer a uniform system of collecting crime and arrest statistical data from contributing law enforcement agencies in the State of Washington and present the information needed by each of these groups. This information will not, in itself, prevent crime but it may encourage segments of society to understand the problem and to work together with law enforcement agencies to reduce crime. Additional objectives of ***Crime in Washington***

State 2009 when compiled and evaluated are:

1. To identify the number of crimes reported by contributing agencies.
2. To identify the geographical distribution of reported offenses.
3. To determine whether or not reported crimes have increased or decreased.
4. To determine whether or not reported crimes have increased or decreased by population groups.
5. To determine the number of clearances and the clearance rate for reported offenses.
6. To determine the reported number of arrests by offense, age, sex, and race.
7. To determine the number of law enforcement officers assaulted and killed.
8. To determine the number of commissioned (sworn) and civilian law enforcement employees by gender.
9. To determine the rate per population group of commissioned (sworn) and civilian law enforcement employees.

Crime Factors

Factors relating to crime reporting practices, law enforcement policies, population characteristics, and interpretation all contribute to variation in reported data. Some general factors which may affect the amount of crime reported and type of crime committed are:

1. The density and size of the community population and of its surrounding area.
2. The variations in composition of the population, particularly to age.
3. The economic status, education, and recreation characteristics of the community population.
4. The stability of population with respect to residents' mobility, commuting patterns, and transient factors.
5. The climate, including seasonal weather conditions, and other geographical variations.
6. The religious characteristics of the population.
7. The effective strength of law enforcement agencies.
8. The policies of other components of the criminal justice system (i.e., prosecutorial, judicial, correctional and probational).
9. The attitude of the public toward law enforcement problems.
10. The crime reporting practices of the citizenry.
11. The administrative and investigative follow-up of the local law enforcement agency, including the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards.

UCR Statistical Interpretation

Statistics are a tool used to summarize information so that patterns or trends become clearer. All statistics must be interpreted with an understanding of what they represent. To draw appropriate conclusions, it is necessary to know what information is included and how it is reported.

To obtain accurate information from many different agencies, the national UCR program has to define the precise methods for counting the number of offenses, arrests, clearances, and value of stolen or recovered

property. The methods of counting and some resulting limitations are explained below.

Classification of Offenses

Summary UCR divides offenses into two major classifications designated as Part I and Part II offenses and different information is collected for each classification. Part I offenses include (1) violent crimes: murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault; and (2) property crimes: burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and, since January 1979, arson. Part I offenses are used to calculate the crime index and crime rate. All other offenses are classified under Part II offenses.

All offenses are classified on the basis of law enforcement investigation in accordance with UCR offense definitions which are not necessarily identical to the revised code of Washington definitions. Because UCR identifies and tallies a police contact, offense classifications are not based on the findings of a court, medical examiner, jury, or other judicial findings.

Counting the Offenses

The number of offenses is counted only for Part I crimes and simple assault. The method of counting varies with the type of crime committed - the number of offenders does not determine the number of offenses.

For murder, non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape and aggravated assault, one offense is counted for EACH VICTIM, regardless of the number of offenders involved.

For robbery and larceny, one offense is counted for EACH DISTINCT OPERATION that is separate in time and place. The number of victims in any one operation does not determine the number of offenses. For example, if 20 people are robbed in a bar at the same time, only one offense has occurred. However, if that robber leaves the bar and holds up a passerby, a second offense has occurred. For burglary, one offense is counted for each structure that is illegally entered. However, when the structure is an apartment house, business, or office building in which units are leased for a period of time, one offense is counted for each unit burglarized. For motor vehicle theft, one offense is counted for each vehicle stolen.

NOTE: Attempts to commit any of the crime index offenses are counted as actual offenses, except attempts to kill and assault to kill are counted as aggravated assaults.

For multiple offenses that occur in one crime incident, only the most serious offense is counted. Part I crimes are ranked according to seriousness and appear in order from most serious to least serious crimes. Example: a robber takes a man's wallet and then beats him causing serious injury. Both a robbery and an aggravated assault have occurred, but because robbery is considered by UCR to be more serious, only the robbery is counted. This is known as the **HIERARCHY RULE**. From one perspective, this method of counting seriously understates the crime problem, but from another, it prevents undue inflation of crime statistics.

- NOTE:** 1. Arson is an exception to the above rule and is counted separately from other offenses.
2. The number of offenses is not reported for Part II offenses.

Arrests

Arrest information is collected for all Part I and Part II offenses according to the age, sex, and race of the offender. It is not possible, however, to correlate race with sex or specific ages because the information is collected independently, thus limiting analysis. Furthermore, arrest figures cannot be directly related to the number of crimes cleared because the arrest totals count all offenders arrested for each offense, and clearance-totals count only the offense for which an arrest or arrests have occurred.

Clearances

An offense is considered cleared (solved) when at least one offender is arrested for a crime, even though several may have been involved. Offenses may also be cleared by exceptional means when the offender commits suicide, makes a dying declaration, confesses while in custody or serving time for another crime, is prosecuted in another jurisdiction for the same offense, is a juvenile who is handled by notifying the parents, or when the victim refuses to prosecute or another jurisdiction refuses to extradite the offender, etc.

Clearances are counted as "adult" and "juvenile". A "juvenile" clearance is counted only when juveniles are exclusively involved in the clearance of an offense. If the arrest of both adults and juveniles result in a clearance, it is counted as an "adult" clearance.

NOTE: Not all crimes are cleared within the calendar year in which the offense occurs.

Information Grouping

The crime statistics reported by an individual agency indicate what is happening in one particular area, but to make rational comparisons among a number of jurisdictions, communities with similar characteristics need to be grouped together. It may be important to know how a city compares with cities of similar size, or how patterns of crime differ in various types of communities. Grouping agencies with similar characteristics allows these determinations to be made. Such comparative analysis provides the basic information for long-range criminal justice planning.

UCR groups jurisdictions on the basis of population size in this report, and if any types of comparisons are to be made, the reader should also consider what types of communities are being compared. Grouping by population size considers only the population of the reporting area. It does not consider proximity to a major metropolitan area in spite of the fact that widely different crime patterns could be expected in a city of 30,000 which is a suburb of Seattle or Tacoma and one which is in a rural area.

In this report, grouping by population does not take into account the urban/suburban/rural character of the area, and includes a wide range of populations in each category. For use in interpreting this report, the UCR

grouping systems are listed below:

Crime Index

The crime index is a basic measure of crime which can be used for comparing the extent of crime among cities, counties and states of similar size. The index is simply the total number of certain offenses that occur in a given area in a given calendar period (usually quarterly and annually). The offenses are murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

The offenses were selected as indicators of the total amount of criminal activity because they are serious offenses that are the focus of widespread concern. They occur with sufficient frequency to reflect fluctuations in the overall level of criminal activity. They are most likely to be reported and reported accurately to law enforcement due to their seriousness. They are offenses that can be clearly and specifically defined. Notwithstanding its usefulness, the index does have limitations.

The relationship between the index offenses and total criminal activity, both reported and unreported, has never been firmly established. The varying severity of offenses is not taken into account, resulting in equal weight being given to a shoplifting and a forcible rape. Further, the actual incidence of crime in a city may not be accurately depicted by the index if the majority of the city's crime involves non-index offenses such as gambling and narcotics.

Crime Rate

The crime rate is based on the index, but adjusts the index for variances in population by indicating the number of index offenses for each 1,000 persons (other base population increments may be used such as the number of index offenses per 100,000). This means that comparisons may be made among several areas with different populations or within one area with different populations over a period of time, without the information being biased by population differences. For most general comparisons, the crime rate is probably the most accurate to use.

To calculate the crime rate, first divide the population of the area by 1,000, and divide the crime index by that answer. For example, if a city has a population of 273,000 and a crime index of 21,257 the calculations would be:

1. 273,000 divided by 1,000 = 273.0
2. 21,257 divided by 273.0 = 77.86

Thus, although the city's crime index is 21,257, its crime rate (the number of crimes for each 1,000 people) is 77.86.

NIBRS: Changes In Crime Reporting

The data included in this report are comprised of Summary UCR data. While of value, it is limited in details that may be more useful to law enforcement agencies, legislators, researchers, and others. Since additional factors are generally collected by most law enforcement agencies in today's computerized world, the national UCR program was redesigned to include new guidelines and greater depth to the data. The program, National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS), collects a multitude of data elements on each single crime occurrence.

In December 2006, after many years of participating in the testing process that is required to officially collect and submit accurate NIBRS data, Washington State was certified by the FBI. At this time, the state program is working with local law enforcement agencies to provide a better understanding of NIBRS to ensure accuracy and data quality. By January 1, 2012, Washington State will provide NIBRS crime statistics rather than Summary data for all reporting agencies.

The additional information will provide more comprehensive data for reports and analysis. NIBRS collects data on each single incident and arrest within 22 offense categories (Group A offenses) made up of 46 specific crimes, rather than the 8 offenses collected in Summary UCR reporting. For each of these reported offenses, various facts about the crime are collected. Additionally, there are 11 separate offenses, or Group B offenses, for which only arrest data is provided.

The Group A offenses collected in the NIBRS program are: Arson; Assault; Bribery; Burglary; Counterfeiting/Forgery; Drug Offenses; Embezzlement; Extortions; Fraud; Gambling Offenses; Homicide; Kidnapping; Larceny; Motor Vehicle Theft; Pornography Offenses; Robbery; Forcible Sex Offenses; Non-Forcible Sex Offenses; Possession of Stolen Property; Vandalism; and Weapon Law Violations.

Group A offenses include statistical data on the incident, all offenses committed, property involved, weapons involved, victim and offender demographics, arrest information, and clearance status.

Group B offenses, for which only arrest data are collected include: Bad Checks; Curfew/Vagrancy Violations;

Disorderly Conduct; Driving Under the Influence; Drunkenness; Non-Violent Family Offenses; Liquor Law Violations; Peeping Tom; Runaway; Trespass of Real Property; and All Other Offenses (non-traffic).

Mandatory Reporting

- **Domestic Violence**

Domestic violence offenses are collected as mandated by the Washington State Legislature. These are not separate offenses from those collected in Summary UCR but because of the nature of the relationship of those involved, these offenses are further categorized for analysis. The offenses collected are limited to: homicide, forcible rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, arson, and violation of protection/no-contact orders.

- **Hate Crime (Malicious Harassment)**

Like domestic violence offenses, hate crimes are not distinct, separate offenses. They are traditional offenses that are motivated in whole, or in part, by the offender's bias. The motivations are specific and include biases against race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, or mental, physical, or sensory handicap. The offenses collected are limited to: murder, forcible rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, arson, intimidation, and vandalism. Data collected in the hate crime program are forwarded to the FBI.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CODE OF ETHICS

I RECOGNIZE the badge of my office as a symbol of public faith, and I accept it as a public trust to be held so long as I am true to the ethics of police service. I will never engage in acts of corruption or bribery, nor will I condone such acts by other police officers. I will cooperate with all legally authorized agencies and their representatives in the pursuit of justice.

I KNOW that I alone am responsible for my own standard of professional performance and will take every reasonable opportunity to enhance and improve my level of knowledge and competence.

I WILL constantly strive to achieve these objectives and ideals, dedicating myself before God to my chosen profession...law enforcement.





Number of Violent Offenses




Violent Crime Rate








Murder Trend 2000 - 2009




Murder by Weapon 2009




**Murder by Age - Offenders
2009 Total - 216**






Gang-Related Homicides 2000 - 2009




Drug-Related Homicides (felony and non-felony) 2000 - 2009









**Aggravated Assault Trend



**Aggravated Assault by Weapon





Washington State Total Property Crime 2000 - 2009






Burglary 2000 - 2009




Burglary by Type of Entry 2009




Larceny Theft 2000 - 2009







Arrests

Data in this section represent the number of persons arrested, not the number of charges lodged. The following tables depict counts for non-traffic offenses in which an individual was taken into custody, cited, or summoned to appear in court. In some instances, an arrest may be counted when a juvenile is taken into custody but released without being charged. These numbers are derived from monthly Uniform Crime Reports submitted by Washington State law enforcement agencies.



Offenses by Agency and Statewide Total

The following section provides individual law enforcement agencies' offense counts for violent and property offenses. Also included are statewide totals and statewide information on stolen property by type and value. These numbers are derived from monthly Uniform Crime Reports submitted by Washington State law enforcement agencies.

Populations are based on the Washington State Office of Financial Management "Official April 1, 2009 Population Estimates", except for university police, port police, tribal police, and non-reporting agencies which show zero populations.

The population data reflect permanent residents only. It does not include transient and visitor populations or residents of the military bases and state or federal hospitals.

NOTE: Those agencies reporting less than 12 months of data for either year will not show the "Percent of Change"




Crime in Washington State 2008 - 2009



Officers Killed or Assaulted

The information in the following pages is derived from monthly Uniform Crime Reports submitted by Washington State law enforcement agencies, with the exception of the memoriam.

Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted

Law enforcement officers may become victims of assault as a consequence of their occupations. The Uniform Crime Report addresses all assaults on officers which involve more than verbal abuse or minor resistance to an arrest.

In 2009, six law enforcement officers were feloniously killed and one law enforcement officer was accidentally killed in the line of duty in the State of Washington.

In 2009, contributing agencies reported 822 officer assaults with 21.8% of the total assaults resulting in personal injury to the officer.

The type of activity in which an officer was most likely to be assaulted was responding to disturbance calls, which accounted for 35.2% of the total officers assaulted. Other activities of significance were: attempting other arrests, 15.8% of the total; traffic pursuits and stops, 10.0% of the total; investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, 9.9% of the total; and handling or transporting prisoners, 8.8% of the total. During 2009, police assaults were cleared (by arrest or exceptional means) 86.3% of the time.

Hands, fists, and feet were the primary weapons used in 79.6% of the total assaults, followed by other dangerous weapons (not a knife or firearm), 14.6%; firearm, 3.5%; and knife or cutting instrument, 2.3%. The type of assignment in which most assaults occurred was a one-officer vehicle assisted, resulting in 392 assaults or 47.7%, followed by one-officer vehicle alone, with 246 assaults or 29.9%. During a 24-hour period using 8-hour shifts, 8 p.m. to 4 a.m. reflected the most assaults, 440 assaults, or 53.5% of the total. The fewest assaults occurred between 4 a.m. and 12 p.m., 117 or 14.2%.

These statistics indicate that officers face the highest risk of assault when responding to disturbance calls between the hours of 8 p.m. and 4 a.m., in a one-officer vehicle assisted. The offender is most likely to use hands, fists, and feet as a weapon.

Officer Timothy Brenton was sitting in the passenger seat of a patrol car with a trainee discussing a just completed traffic stop when a vehicle pulled alongside the patrol car and the occupant opened fire. Officer Brenton was fatally wounded at the scene. His trainee officer was grazed but was able to return fire at the shooter's fleeing vehicle.

The suspect was on the run for several days, but was wounded and captured. The suspect is also believed to be involved in the arson of four police vehicles in the city maintenance yard days before. He is being held and tried for the death of Officer Brenton.

Officer Brenton served with the Seattle Police Department for nine years and previously with the Hoquiam and La Conner Police Departments. He is also a U.S. Army veteran and served in the Gulf War. His father and uncle are both retired Seattle police officers.

He is survived by his wife, Lisa, daughter, Kayleigh, and son, Quinn.







2009 Domestic Violence Murders By Relationship (victim to offender)



Hate Crime

Hate crimes are not separate, distinct offenses, but rather traditional crimes motivated by the offender's bias. This data is derived from quarterly hate crime reports submitted by Washington State law enforcement agencies.

Hate Bias

Introduction

In response to the passage of the Hate Crime Statistics Act of 1990, the Washington State Legislature directed every law enforcement agency within Washington to report hate bias offenses to the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs.

FBI reporting guidelines and forms are used and the data is forwarded to the FBI for inclusion in the national statistics. In keeping with the Washington State Malicious Harassment Act, two additional motivational categories were added for our state: anti-disability (physical, mental, sensory), and anti-gender (male and female). Hate crime offenses with an anti-handicap or anti-gender motivation are not forwarded to the FBI.

Determining the prevalence of hate crime is an important responsibility for the entire law enforcement community. Tremendous interest has been shown by the general public, law enforcement agencies, legislative bodies, human interest groups, and others relative to the collection of hate crime data.

The commitment of Washington State law enforcement is the key to the success of Washington State's hate crime data collection program. Without law enforcement's active participation in the collection of these statistics, this report would not be possible.

Hate Crime Definition and Methodology

The Washington State Hate Crime Malicious Harassment Act defines hate crime as criminal offenses that manifest evidence motivated by the offender's bias against the victim's race, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability or gender.

Because of the difficulty of ascertaining the offender's subjective motivation, bias is reported when the law enforcement investigation reveals sufficient objective facts to lead a reasonable person to conclude that the offender's actions were motivated, in whole or in part, by bias.

Hate crimes are not separate, distinct offenses, but rather traditional crimes motivated by the offender's bias. The eleven offenses collected in the Hate Crime reporting program are the eight Index offenses (murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson) plus simple assault, intimidation, and vandalism. Words alone do not constitute an offense unless the context or circumstances surrounding the words indicate the words are a threat. Threatening words do not constitute an offense if it is apparent to the victim that the person does not have the ability to carry out the threat.

A hate crime incident can involve more than one offense, victim, and/or offender. For counting purposes, one offense is counted for each victim of a crime against a person, and one offense is counted for each distinct incident of a crime against property, regardless of the numbers of victims.

Following a calendar quarter, law enforcement agencies submit a Hate Crime Incident Report for each bias-motivated incident and a summary report for the quarter. If there were no hate crime incidents during a quarter, the agency still reports the summary that will show there were no hate crime incidents.

2009 HATE BIAS CRIME

Volume

During 2009, 211 bias motivated criminal incidents were reported by 262 law enforcement agencies in 39 counties. The 211 incidents involved 292 separate offenses, 312 victims, and 179 known offenders. It is important to remember that there can be more than one offense within a single incident.

Offenses

Crimes against persons comprised 70% of the 292 offenses reported during 2009. Intimidation was the single most frequently-reported hate crime among all offenses measured, accounting for 49% of the total. Following were vandalism of property, 30%; simple assault, 14%; aggravated assault, 6%; rape, robbery, and burglary totaling 1%. There were no reported offenses of murder, larceny, motor vehicle theft, or arson related to hate crime in 2009.





Hate Crime by Motivation



Glossary

Washington Uniform Crime Reporting

Glossary

ACTUAL OFFENSE:

An offense which law enforcement personnel confirm to have happened.

ADULT:

A person who is 18 years of age or older at the time of committing a crime.

ALL OTHER OFFENSES:

State and local offenses not otherwise specified.

ARRESTS:

The act of taking a person into custody by authority of law to charge him or her with a criminal offense. An adult arrest should be reported when a law enforcement officer detains an individual with the express intent of seeking charges against this person for a specific criminal offense(s) and a record is made of the detention.

ARSON:

Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED:

An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. All assaults by one person upon another with the intent to kill, maim, or inflict severe bodily injury with the use of any dangerous weapon are classified as aggravated.

ASSAULT, SIMPLE:

An unlawful attack or attempted attack by one person upon another in which no weapon was used and which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

BURGLARY:

The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

CLEARANCE:

The solving of an offense by arrest, or in some circumstances, by exceptional means.

CLEARANCE RATE:

Percentage of the total crimes cleared compared to the number reported.

Example:

- a. Number of robbery clearances, 38
- b. Number of total robberies, 72
Divide: 38 by 72 = .528
Multiply: .528 X 100 = 52.8
- c. 52.8% clearance rate for robberies.

CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS:

Sub classification of the Crime Index, which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, and aggravated assault.

CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY:

Sub classification of the Crime Index, which encompasses robbery, burglary, larceny (theft), motor vehicle theft and arson.

CRIME INDEX:

Classification of eight offenses selected for their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and likelihood of being reported. Includes murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (theft), motor vehicle theft and arson.

CURFEW AND LOITERING LAWS - PERSONS UNDER 18:

Transgressions of curfew or loitering ordinances pertaining to juveniles.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT:

Committing or attempting to commit a breach of the peace. Includes affray, unlawful assembly, disturbing the peace, disturbing meetings, disorderly conduct in state institutions, blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language, desecrating the flag, and refusing to assist an officer.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE:

Crimes committed by one family or household member against another; "family or household members" means spouses, former spouses, persons who have a child in common regardless of whether they have been married or have lived together at any time, adult persons related by blood or marriage, adult persons who are presently residing together or who have resided together in the past, persons sixteen years of age or older who are presently residing together or who have resided together in the past and who have or have had a dating relationship, persons sixteen years of age or older with whom a person sixteen years of age or older has or has had a dating relationship, and persons who have a biological or legal parent-child relationship, including stepparents and stepchildren and grandparents and grandchildren.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE:

The driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics. This includes operating a motor vehicle, engine, train, streetcar, boat, etc., while intoxicated.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATION:

Transgression of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.

DRUNKENNESS:

Not applicable in Washington State (except on Indian reservations).

EMBEZZLEMENT:

Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING:

All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

FRAUD:

Converting and obtaining money or property by false pretenses other than forgery or counterfeiting.

GAMBLING:

Promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal games of chance.

HATE BIAS CRIME:

See Malicious Harassment

INCENDIARY:

Involving a deliberate burning of property.

JUVENILE:

A person who is under the age of 18 at the time of committing a crime.

LARCENY (THEFT):

The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another or the attempt to do so.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE RATE:

The number of employees per 1,000 inhabitants. Divide the jurisdiction's population by 1,000 and divide the number of employees in the law enforcement agency by this number.

LIQUOR LAW VIOLATION:

Transgression of any state or local liquor law except drunkenness and driving while intoxicated.

MALICIOUS HARASSMENT:

A person is guilty of malicious harassment if he/she maliciously and intentionally commits an offense because of his/her perception of the victim's race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, or mental, physical, or sensory handicap.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT:

The theft or attempted theft of a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails.

MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER:

The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

PART I OFFENSES:

Eight major offenses as defined in the Crime Index.

PART II OFFENSES:

All other crime classifications outside those defined as Part I.

PROPERTY CRIMES:

Sub classification of the Crime Index, which encompasses burglary, larceny (theft), motor vehicle theft and arson.

PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE:

Committing or attempting to commit sex offenses of a commercialized nature.

RAPE:

The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Rapes or attempts accomplished by force or threat of force are classified as forcible regardless of the age of the female victim.

REPORTED OFFENSE:

An act, which comes to the attention of law enforcement authorities as a possible offense.

RETURN A:

The form used by law enforcement agencies to collect data on offenses that become known to them.

ROBBERY:

The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or putting the victim in fear.

RUNAWAY:

Protective custody of juveniles under local statute.

SEX OFFENSES:

Offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, other than forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice.

STOLEN PROPERTY, BUYING, RECEIVING AND POSSESSING:

Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property or the attempt to commit such an offense.

SUPPLEMENT TO RETURN A:

A monthly reporting of the nature of crime and the type and value of property stolen and recovered.

UNFOUNDED OFFENSE:

An act reported to law enforcement authorities, which, upon investigation, proves to be false or baseless.

VAGRANCY:

Offenses of vagrancy, begging, loitering (adults), vagabondage and being a "suspicious character or person, etc."

VANDALISM:

The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacing of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

VIOLENT CRIMES:

Sub-classification of the Crime Index, which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.

WEAPON OFFENSES:

Offenses and attempted offenses against weapons regulations. Includes manufacture, sale, possession, or carrying open or concealed deadly weapons or silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; possession of deadly weapons by aliens.
