When to Use "Cyberspace" as a Location Type

Definition of offense Location Type "Cyberspace":

A virtual or internet-based network of two or more computers in separate locations which communicate either through wireless or wire connections.

Cyberspace can be the location only if the related offense is:

- Counterfeiting/Forgery
- Credit Card/ATM Fraud
- Destruction/Damage/Vandalism
- Drug/Narcotic Violation
- Drug Equipment Violation
- Embezzlement
- Extortion/Blackmail
- False Pretenses/Swindle/Con Game
- Gambling Equipment Violation
- Gambling Betting/Wagering
- Gambling Operating/Promoting

- Hacking/Computer Invasion
- Human Trafficking Offense
- Identity Theft
- Impersonation
- Intimidation
- Pornography/Obscene Material
- Prostitution
- Prostitution Assisting/Promoting
- Prostitution Purchasing
- Stolen Property Offense
- Weapon Law Violation
- Welfare Fraud
- Wire Fraud
