NIBRS Tip of the Month Hate Crime Reporting



Per RCW 36.28A.030, agencies must report monthly statistics of Malicious Harassment (Hate Crime) to WASPC via the UCR Program.

- A hate crime is not a separate, distinct crime, but rather an offense motivated by the offender's bias.
- The reporting agency should have a two-tier decision-making procedure in place: 1) the law enforcement officer who initially responds to the alleged hate crime and 2) a second-level judgment officer or unit to review the facts of the incident to determine if the incident involved a bias-motivated crime.
- Up to five (5) bias motivations per offense may be submitted.
